As summer 2022 comes to a close, we recognize that it has been a good season for the Family Justice Center Sonoma County (FJCSC). On June 15th, we kicked off the summer with International Elder Abuse day. Every year an estimated 5 million, or 1 in 10 older Americans experience physical, mental, and financial elder abuse, neglect, or exploitation. Locally, there were over 6000 reports of elder abuse in Sonoma County this year alone. In response, the FJCSC and all local senior





centers displayed purple flags in June representing each case of elder abuse in our community. To help address this crisis locally, the FJCSC, partners with Council on Aging to provide an onsite Elder Advocate. The Elder Advocate provides case management services for seniors who may be homeless or victims of elder abuse. The focus is to assist and empower the senior as they stabilize their lives and navigate the criminal justice system, while providing t protection necessary to achieve

Following Elder Abuse Awareness month, the FJCSC team participated in a numb events to raise public awareness about family violence, learn about the unique ne populations, and provide information about the variety of services available to as services include crisis counseling, therapy, restraining orders, immigration service services, as well as case management, support and educational groups, Camp HO specialized advocates for elder abuse, domestic violence,

and sexual assault. Under the leadership of the DA's Office, in partnership with supporters like you, the FJCSC's partnerships and services have continued to expand. It is this expansion of services that enables us to be fierce advocates for survivors.

In August 2022, the FJCSC sponsored a multidisciplinary training and certification on the Danger Assessment, created and taught by Dr. Jacquelyn C. Campbell. The assessment is an evidence-based instrument that helps to determine the level of danger an abused woman has of being killed by her intimate partner. We frequently bring together our law enforcement partners, victim advocates, and community partners to Improve our skills by learning about the latest topics and best-practices from dynamic, highly respected experts in the field.

Every year 3-4 million women in the U.S. are abused and 1,500-1,600 are killed by their abusers. The challenge for those who encounter abused women is to identify those with the highest level of danger.


